- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within [2] weeks.
- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than [5] weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]

4. Termination of the agreement

In case of termination a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September of one academic year will only take effect as of 1 September of the following academic year. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."

In the event that notice of termination of the agreement is given, students who have already been selected and accepted for the exchange programme may still participate. Notwithstanding the termination of the agreement, each institution agrees that it will continue to fulfil its responsibilities to Exchange Students already registered at their institution until the completion of their particular exchange period

F. Information

1. Grading systems of the institutions

F PARIS342:

Each course is graded on a scale from 1 to 20.

The French grades can be read as follows:

- Between 16 and 20: outstanding/high honours (this is scarcely used and can be considered as a A+ in an American grading system)
- Between 14 and 15,9: very good (this is fairly used and correspond to an A in the American grading system)
- Between 12 and 13.9: Satisfactory/ Quite good (can be compared to a B in the America grading system)
- Between 10 and 11.9: Fairly pass / quite good (can be compared to a B- in the American grading system)
- Between 8 and 9.9: Correct passing (can be compared to a C in the American grading system
- Under 8: resitting exams (failed)
