Inter-institutional¹ agreement 2020-2023² between institutions from Programme and Partner Countries³

The institutions named below agree to cooperate for the exchange of students and/or staff in the context of the Erasmus+ programme. They commit to respect the quality requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education in all aspects of the organisation and management of the mobility, in particular the recognition of the credits (or equivalent) awarded to students by the partner institution. The institutions also commit to sound and transparent management of funds allocated to them through Erasmus+.

Before mobility

- Provide information on courses (content, level, scope, language) well in advance of the mobility periods, so as to be transparent to all parties and allow mobile students to make well-informed choices about the courses they will follow.
- Ensure that outbound mobile participants are well prepared for the mobility, including having attained the necessary level of linguistic proficiency.
- Ensure that student and staff mobility for education or training purposes is based on a learning agreement for students and a mobility agreement for staff validated in advance between the sending and receiving institutions or enterprises and the mobile participants.
- Provide assistance related to obtaining visas, when required, for incoming and outbound mobile participants. Costs for visas can be covered with the mobility grants. See the information / visa section for contact details.
- Provide assistance related to obtaining insurance, when required, for Incoming and outbound mobile participants. During and after mobility

- Ensure equal academic treatment and services for home students and staff and incoming
 mobile participants and integrate incoming mobile participants into the institution's
 everyday life, and have in place appropriate mentoring and support arrangements for
 mobile participants as well as appropriate linguistic support to incoming mobile
 participants.
- Accept all activities indicated in the learning agreement as counting towards the degree, provided these have been satisfactorily completed by the mobile student.
- Provide, free-of-charge, incoming mobile students and their sending institutions with transcripts in English or in the language of the sending institution containing a full, accurate and timely record of their achievements at the end of their mobility period.
- Support the reintegration of mobile participants and give them the opportunity, upon return, to build on their experiences for the benefit of the Institution and their peers.
- Ensure that staff are given recognition for their teaching and training activities undertaken during the mobility period, based on a mobility agreement.
- Travel, subsistence, visa and insurance of each mobility will be reimbursed by CZU Prague from the project budget as a payment, fixed by EU regulations. Each incoming staff/student will receive the payment within the first week of the stay at CZU Prague / instalments in cash. All details are managed by the Erasmus+ KA107 Grant agreement No. 2020-1-CZ01-KA107-077664.

1. CZ PRAHA 02

Selection criteria for staff:

Each applicant needs to attend a motivation interview with the vice-dean for the International Relations of the FTA. The selection procedure will respect the right of equal opportunities for each staff member. The teachers of animal ecology and behaviour, monitoring methods and data processing are more suitable for this mobility. Minimum level of degree of outgoing Czech staff is Ph.D. All the details of the selection procedure will be announced in advance by separate document issued by the vice-dean for the International Relations of the FTA.

Selection criteria for students:

Each applicant needs to submit Transcript of Records, Motivation letter, CV, study/training plan at the host institution, thesis supervisor agreement on joining the project and to pass the personal/on-line motivation interview with the vice-dean for the International Relations of the FTA. All the details of the selection procedure will be announced in advance by separate document issued by the vice-dean of the FTA.

Recognition tools:

Each outgoing staff will receive the certificate. Each outgoing staff is obliged to hand in the original of the Erasmus Mobility agreement and Confirmation of the stay. Each outgoing student is obliged to hand in the original of the Erasmus Mobility agreement, Confirmation of the stay and Transcript of Records (in case of student mobility for studies). The mobility will be recognized as an obligatory training abroad.

Infrastructure to welcome students and staff with disabilities at CZ PRAHA02:

Counselling centre for students with special needs offers its services to incoming students and staff. All buildings of faculties, lecture halls, cafeterias and dormitories on campus have barrier-free access.

2. UCAD

Selection criteria for staff:

The selection procedure will respect the right of equal opportunities for each staff member. The teachers of animal and plant ecology and conservation are more suitable for this mobility. As the courses at the institution of delivery are taught in English, the applicant will pass the on-line interview with the vice-dean for the International Relations of the FTA in English. The staff from UCAD is not obliged to have Ph.D. degree for mobility. All the details of the selection procedure will be announced in advance by separate document issued by the vice-dean for the International Relations of the FTA.

Selection criteria for students:

Each applicant needs to submit Transcript of Records, Motivation letter, CV, study/training plan at the host institution, recommendation letter and to pass the on-line motivation interview with the vice-dean for the International Relations of the FTA. All the details of the selection procedure will be announced in advance by separate document issued by the vice-dean of the FTA.

Recognition tools:

Each outgoing staff will receive the certificate. Each outgoing staff is obliged to hand in the original of the Erasmus Mobility agreement and Confirmation of the stay. Each outgoing student is obliged to hand in the original of the Erasmus Mobility agreement, Confirmation of the stay and Transcript of Records (in case of student mobility for studies).

Infrastructure for staff and students with disabilities (if any):

UCAD infrastructure supports people with disabilities.

F. Calendar

1. Applications/information on nominated students must reach the receiving institution by:

- The receiving institution will send its decision within 2 weeks from the application deadline.
- 3. A Transcript of Records wlll be issued by the receiving institution no later than 2 weeks after the assessment period has flnished at the receiving HEI.
- 4. Termination of the agreement

It is up to the involved institutions to agree on the procedure for modifying or terminating the inter-institutional agreement. However, in the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 31 July 2021 will only take effect as of 31 July 2023. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."

G. Information

1. Grading systems of the institutions

CZ PRAHA02 grading system:

Local grade 1 = excellent A (ECTS grade)

Local grade 2 = very good B (ECTS grade)

Local grade 3 = good D (ECTS grade)

Local grade 4 = failed F (ECTS grade)

Local "Zápočet" = Credited / Passed = Some courses are not concluded by examination.

Students' achievements are not graded, but evaluated "passed/failed" only where the student has attained a satisfactory level and is awarded credits being "credited".

UCAD grading system:

FAILED If the candidate obtains less than 10/20

FAIR if the candidate obtains a score of at least 10/20 and less than 12/20 on the general total of the teaching units;

PRETTY GOOD if the candidate obtains a score at least equal to 12/20 and less than 14/20 on the general total of the teaching units;

GOOD if the candidate obtains a score of at least 14/20 and less than 16/20 on the general total of the teaching units;

VERY GOOD if the candidate obtains a score of at least 16/20 on the general total of the teaching units

2. Visa

The sending and receiving institutions will provide assistance, when required, in securing visas for incoming and outbound mobile participants, according to the requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education.

3. Insurance

The sending and receiving institutions will provide assistance in obtaining insurance for incoming and outbound mobile participants, according to the requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education.

The receiving institution will inform mobile participants of cases In which insurance cover is not automatically provided.

Information and assistance can be provided by the following contact points and information

- The grant for travel costs for one outgoing teacher/staff is in the amount of 820 EUR.
- The grant for subsistence costs for one outgoing teacher/staff is 140 EUR per day, 98 EUR per day in case the mobility will last more than 14 days.
- The outgoing teacher/staff will receive 70 % of this grant on the first working day after his/her arrival at CZ PRAHA02. The rest 30 % will be paid last working day of the mobility, after they fill in the Mobility on-line report. The payment will be collected in cash at the CZU cash desk (opening hours: 8:00 - 12:00, 13:00 - 15:00).
- Outgoing student mobilities will be supported with the grant for travel costs in the
 amount of 820 EUR, and the grant for subsistence costs 800 EUR/month. Students will
 receive 70 % of this grant on the first working day after his/her arrival at CZ PRAHA02,
 and 30 % after they submit all the compulsory documents and fill in the Mobility online report. Both, bank transfer of cash payment of the grant are possible.

6. Promotion and dissemination

Both universities, Programme and Partner university, have agreed to follow all conditions and requirements mentioned in the Agreement No. 2020-1-CZ01-KA107-077664.

UCAD is obliged to provide the Czech University of Life Sciences Prague with the documentation upon the request, in order to fulfil the project rules mentioned in the Agreement No. 2020-1-CZ01-KA107-077664.
