

Exhibit 5 to the IDOA – Exchange of rack space

1. With a view to ensuring redundancy of (some of) their installations involved in the Cooperation in case of an incident, the NEMOs and TSOs using rack space agree to grant to each other the possibility to use, for the installation and operation of equipment used in the context of the Cooperation, part of the rack space that has been or will be rented respectively by or on behalf of the NEMOs and by or on behalf of the TSOs in their respective data centers.

The exchange of rack space can be motivated as follows at the date of entry into force of the Agreement:

The following structure was agreed:

The location of the data centres and structure of the rack space rental can be changed by an ID SC decision.

The modalities for the granting of such use of the rack space shall be determined in good faith by the NEMOs and the TSOs.

- 2. The reciprocal obligations in respect of the rack swap are considered the counterpart for the rack swap and no specific fee shall be due by the NEMOs, respectively the TSOs for the use of each other’s rack space.
- 3. In the context of the exchange of rack space, the TSOs and NEMOs shall comply with Annex 1 to this Exhibit 5 ([REDACTED]).

Annex 1: MPLS Incident Management

Introduction

In the context of the exchange of rack space as agreed between TSOs and NEMOs in Exhibit 5, TSOs and NEMOs have to make sure their MPLS network service providers are respecting the service agreements which shall include the procedure set forth in this document.

If there is any issue and the MPLS network service providers are not responding/etc., then in not urgent cases this will be addressed in the OPSCOM and in case of urgent cases that require immediate resolution in an IC call that would be triggered following the Incident Management Procedure.

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
