

Exhibit 16 to the IDOA: Rollback Procedure

This Exhibit 16 to the IDOA provides some high level principles regarding Rollback, as referred to in Article 7.1.5 of the Agreement.

Rollback means the situation where the ID SC decides to stop operations of the SIDC and to return to the situation before Initial Go-Live ("**Rollback**"). For the avoidance of doubt, the Rollback referred to in this Exhibit is limited to the initial Go-Live. For subsequent LIP(s) Go-Live and releases of the XBID System, a rollback might be put in place that would aim at returning to the previous release and/or configuration of the XBID System.

A decision to Rollback can only be taken by the ID SC within a period of two (2) months starting at Initial Go-Live and Rollback must be activated within the same period.

Each Operational Party shall for its own decide how to organise at the local level, the consequences of such Rollback.

Rollback shall apply until ID SC decides to end the Rollback as set forth below.

During Rollback, the rights and obligations of the Parties under the following Articles of the Agreement shall be suspended:

- Article 7 (Operations) to the exception of the provisions regarding rollback in Article 7.1.5;
- Article 8 (Go-Live);
- Article 9 (Firmness of capacity); and
- Article 10 (Harmonization of maximum and minimum clearing prices).

The practicalities of Rollback activation and of the preparations for a relaunch of the SIDC (if any) and related communication, shall be established in due time by the ID SC (without becoming an additional Exhibit to the Agreement).

Only the ID SC shall decide to end the Rollback and revert to the operation of the SIDC.
