#### Objectives: What do you want to achieve by implementing the project?

The project aims at increasing the quality of Chinese language education by sharing know-how while addressing the common need for comprehensible digital learning materials by developing digital Chinese Grammar Platform (ChinGram), which would provide grammatical description, interactive exercises, and teacher support resources to 100 grammatical points in 5 EU languages. Project will strongly supports transnational cooperation and joint research in the Teaching Chinese as Foreign Language field.

#### Implementation: What activities are you going to implement?

ChinGram activities will include: (i) development of web with online learning platform for Chinese grammar and learners' data collection system; (ii) meetings, lectures and trainings for know-how exchange, know-how transfer and building partnership; (iii) research and data analysis leading to publishing joint research papers; and (iv) dissemination activities (workshops, conference presentations) to apply the outcomes in education and share them with stakeholders.

#### Results: What project results and other outcomes do you expect your project to have?

The main project results include: (i) long-term partnership with shared know-how in Chinese language teaching methodologies and research; (ii) plans and guidelines for project operations; (iii) online ChinGram platform for learners and teachers of Chinese with data collection system; (iv) research papers related to project topic and data analysis; (v) implementation and dissemination of ChinGram in Chinese language education in EU reaching out to new partners for further up-scaling of ChinGram.

Palacký University in Olomouc (Univerzita Palackého v Olomouci, hereafter referred to also as "UP") is a university with long-standing tradition. Founded in the 16th century, it is the oldest university in Moravia and the second-oldest university in the Czech Republic. Today it is a modern higher education facility with a wide range of study programmes and copious scientific and research activities with more than 4000 employees. In 2020, 21,824 students studied in 840 accredited study programmes at eight faculties. The university also provides exchange programmes and lifelong learning programmes. Palacký University Olomouc is one of the very top Czech universities, and ranks among the best universities in the world, according to international rankings - ARWU 2021 (701-800). Palacký University received an HR Excellence in Research Award (HR Award) in 2021. In the 2021+ Strategic Plan for development, Palacký University stipulated internationalization of education and research to be a key priority.

The Department of Asian Studies (kas.upol.cz) includes Chinese, Japanese, Vietnamese, Korean and Indonesian sections. There are roughly 150 students engaged in Chinese programs (BA, MA, Ph.D.) and 15 academics in the Chinese section. The Department has about 500 students in total and 70 academic staff (including full time, part time and adjunct staff). The department also hosted a large research project Sinophone Borderlands (ESF project - OP Research, Development and Education, budget 6,5 mil EUR, www.sinofon.upol.cz) and has experience in administering international projects.

What are the activities and experience of the organisation in the areas relevant for this project? What are the skills and/or expertise of key persons involved in this project?

In the past, Department of Asian Studies at UP worked on several research project focused on Chinese studies, out of which projects relevant to this project include: Innovation of Chinese Philology with the Emphasis on the Practical Education (ESF project, budget 550 000 EUR, 2010-2013), CHINET - Forging a scientific team and international networking in the field of Chinese Studies (ESF project, budget 1,2 mil EUR, 2013-2015) and Chinese at grammar schools and high/secondary schools (Technological Agency CZ, budget 200 000 EUR, 2019-2021). Aarhus University (Aarhus Universitet, hereafter referred to also as "AU") is Denmark's second-largest university with 38,000 students, 8,000 employees, five faculties, and research activities all over the country. The main campus of AU is located in the middle of Jutland, Denmark. Rooted in strong disciplines, researchers and students have been generating new knowledge for over 90 years. In 2020, AU ranks among the top 100 universities in the world in several international rankings - out of over 17,000 universities worldwide. Aarhus University's Strategy 2020-2025 sets seven strategic commitments for following years, including international collaboration, global engagement and the solution of major societal challenges through interdisciplinary research collaboration. In 2020, researchers from Aarhus University also received a number of new funding commitments from the EU framework programme for research, Horizon 2020, including one of the prestigious Synergy Grants from the European Research Council (ERC). All in all, since its launch in 2014, Aarhus University has attracted funding for 425 projects of approximately DKK 1.60 billion from the Horizon 2020 programme.

are both staff members at the School of Culture and Society, Department of Global Studies (DGS), section of China Studies. DGS comprises China studies, Japan studies, South Asian studies, Russian and Balkan studies, Brazilian studies and international studies. There are approximately 300 students enrolled in different programs in 2021 and there are about 40 academic staff, including PhD students. Intensive language training is provided to students for the first two years. Upon completion of two years, students go to partner universities to learn the languages.

What are the activities and experience of the organisation in the areas relevant for this project? What are the skills and/or expertise of key persons involved in this project?

Traditional notions of Chinese grammar teaching are no longer sufficient to prepare teachers and students for a contingent and dynamic world. The types of pedagogy and teaching skills required in traditional grammar teaching have changed due to increasingly digitized education and the students, who were born digital. The Covid-19 pandemic accelerates this change, and highlights the urge to innovate Chinese grammar teaching. Two-year online grammar teaching experiences have clearly proved that a digital grammar platform facilitates students' learning and teachers' teaching. Currently, have been working on the 'KINAGRAM' project, an online grammar program, from which students retrieve grammatical exercises. Upon submission of the exercises, the program provides keys and explanations to the exercises. Our hard-earned experiences in designing the exercises and producing explanations in Danish are expected to enlighten this project, which aims to provide an interactive grammar platform for students and teachers with different linguistic backgrounds.

Founded in 1810, Humboldt University (Humboldt-Universitaet zu Berlin, hereafter referred to also as "UBER") is a public research university with nine faculties in the natural and life sciences, social sciences, humanities and medicine. With some 38,000 students, 440 professors and 2,000 non-professorial teaching and research staff, Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin is among the leading comprehensive universities of Germany. Humboldt-Universitaet zu Berlin currently offers 171 study programs. Together with Freie Universität Berlin, Technische Universität Berlin and the Charité, it is part of a consortium known as Berlin University Alliance (BUA). In 2019 the BUA received a status of excellence within the Excellence Initiative. In the Times Higher Education World University Rankings, Humboldt-Universität ranked 74th in 2022. Humboldt-Universität also hosts number of EU projects, including 2 ERC Synergy Grants, 4 ERC Starting Grants, 6 ERC Consolidator Grants and 5 ERC Advanced Grants.

The IAAW offers a broad spectrum of Asian and African languages that are integrated into BA and MA programmes in Area Studies. The IAAW has roughly 1,000 students enrolled in the different programmes, paid staff members (both full time, part time and adjunct staff) number ca. 100. Intensive language training is offered during the first two years of the BA programme in Asian and African Studies; students have the option of continuing their training at one of UBER's partner universities in Asia. In the past, was a project leader of projects Language Diversity in the Sinophone World, and Taiwan in Asia: Connections and Comparisons.

What are the activities and experience of the organisation in the areas relevant for this project? What are the skills and/or expertise of key persons involved in this project?

The East Asian Section of the Institute of Asian and African Studies boasts a brod spectrum of activities in Chinese linguistics and Teaching Chinese as a Foreign Language. Grammar instruction is a distinct and critical component of UBER's Chinese language curriculum. In the past years, attempts have been made to incorporate more interactive elements both inside and outside the classroom, rather than relying exclusively on the traditional grammar lecture format. Recent experience has shown that digital technology can be used to enhance student-teacher interaction and assist teachers in monitoring students' progress. Furthermore, effective digital activities can be designed to "flip the classroom" and foster autonomous learning. In the past, self-designed grammar instructional materials using a variety of different learning websites (e.g., Wordwall, Quizlet) and collaborative tools (e.g., Google Docs, Moodle Ethpad) were devised. Given that UBER has students from various European countries, a cross-lingual digital Chinese grammar learning platform would benefit the individual needs of students with different language backgrounds.

The University is the oldest school of Oriental Studies in Europe with a rich tradition in languages, cultural and social studies, from Europe to Asia, and from Africa to the Americas.

From the very beginning, "L'Orientale" University has been engaged in intense international cultural relations, constantly collaborating with diverse academic institutions of other countries, thus, providing its students with an education able to meet the demands of the modern world.

At present, the Orientale University offers 6 Degree programmes in the fields of Eastern Asian and African Cultures, Political Sciences and International Relations, Translations Studies, American and Latin American Studies, Archeology, Comparative studies.
