Dear Lut,

as you know we are involved as partners to the Institute of Chemical Technology in Prague in the TRIGGER project.

One of the actions in the GAP is gender dimension in research training. We had a first session with a general introduction of why this is relevant and how it is addressed in H2020 and we would like to start planning further sessions.

I would like to ask you whether Yellow Window would be available for cooperation and under what conditions. The plan is to have another session in fall, and then two per year for the duration of the project, always ideally targeting a concrete research area relevant to the ICT Prague.

The training in fall would be held on 21 October, and I was wondering whether it would be feasible for Yellow Window to facilitate it.

The issue at the moment is time and attendance. It can be expected that people will probably be willing to participate only if the workshop does not last more than 2,5 hours, which I concede is very short, but this is the situation at this moment as very few people recognize the relevance of the issue.

We still need to talk to our partner at the ICT whether to focus this session or to do another more general one to introduce the approach (there were about 15 people attending the first workshop we had, we are hoping that having foreign experts will also attract greater audience).

Could you please let me know whether you and/or your team members would be in principle available and whether you could do a short session of 2,5 hours max. and under what conditions.
