We trust our partner universities to nominate students with language level C1 or higher in English. Students do not need to provide test results; a statement from their home university signed by the Erasmus+ coordinator or a representative of the Language Institute is sufficient. TU Delft carefully monitors the English language proficiency of incoming exchange students. Should a student's language ability not meet our required level, TU Delft may require the student to re-instate proof of their English proficiency by providing test results.

 - TU Delft strives to make all academic programs accessible for students and staff with a disability. To do this, all the university buildings must be accessible; but this can also mean that the classroom, lecture hall and laboratory facilities are altered in such a way as to make it is easier for you to follow your academic courses.  - Exchange students will meet the admission requirements of the host university in terms of prerequisites for courses and language proficiency.
 - Exchange students will be admitted as full time, non-graduating students at the host university. They can be registered at TU Delft for an uninterrupted period of 12 months maximum. Any exchange student wishing to continue their studies after the exchange period of 12 months must register as either a regular student at TU Delft if the objective is to obtain a degree from the university or as a free mover (who cannot obtain degrees). Both statuses require the payment of tuition fees. Free movers may be registered at TU Delft for an uninterrupted period of up to 12 months.
 - TU Delft will provide an obligatory orientation programme for incoming exchange students.
 - Exchange students are entitled to the same rights and privileges as students normally enrolled at the host university, except for the right for graduation.
 - The host university will comply with all relevant health and safety regulations of the host country for incoming exchange students.
 - The home university will inform the host university previous to the exchange about any disabilities to ensure that relevant support can be put in place.

Ownership of intellectual property created by exchange students as part of their enrolment at the host institution will be governed by the host institution's policy on ownership of intellectual property.

2. Admission decision

The receiving institution will send its decision within 8 weeks at the latest (TU Delft) / 5 weeks (UCT Prague).

3. Transcript of Records

A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks (TU Delft) / 5 weeks (UCT Prague) after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. 4. Termination of the agreement

In case of termination a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September of one academic year will only take effect as of 1 September of the following academic year. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict".

F. Information

1. Grading systems of the institutions

Dutch grading scale

The Dutch grading scale, implemented from primary school through university level, goes from 1 (very poor) to 10 (excellent). At TU Delft final marks are rounded off to whole and half figures. A 6.0 is a pass. Although the scale runs from 1.0 to 10.0, the marks 9.0 and 9.5 are not frequently awarded and 10s are extremely rare. The meaning of the marks is as follows:

Mark	Definition	Mark	Definition
9.5 - 10.0	Excellent	6.0	Satisfactory
8.5 - 9.0	Very good	4.5 – 5.5	Nearly satisfactory
7.5 - 8.0	Good	3.5 – 4.0	Unsatisfactory
6.5 – 7.0	More than satisfactory	1.0 - 3.0	Very poor

Sometimes a 'V' is awarded instead of a mark to indicate that the requirements for a particular subject have been fulfilled. 'VR' instead of a mark indicates that a student has been exempted from an examination or practical

exercise on the grounds of a previous examination, degree audit or practical exercise completed within the higher education system that corresponds with the subject for which exemption is sought, as regards content and study load, or on the grounds of knowledge and/or skills acquired outside the higher education system.

Grading systems and 'grading culture' vary from country to country. In the Netherlands a 1-10 grading scale is commonly used. The Dutch grading culture is rather conservative: a 10 or even a 9, is not often awarded. At TU Delft even higher standards are the norm. The average grading results of TU Delft BSc and MSc students are available at
